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1. Associate Degree Program Overview

The Basic Nursing Program at Edison State College (ESC) is offered to assist individuals to obtain an Associate of Science Degree in Nursing. The program is comprised of general education courses as well as clinical nursing courses. The curriculum incorporates classroom instruction, clinical laboratory simulation, and clinical practice in area hospitals, long-term care facilities, and various community health centers. It is recommended but not required that all general education courses are completed before entering the nursing program. Graduates of the program will possess the knowledge, values, and skills essential to practice nursing in a dynamic and rapidly changing health care environment. Graduates are eligible to take the licensure examination (NCLEX-RN) administered by the State Board of Nursing in Florida.

Edison State College is an open access state college serving Southwest Florida. The Associate Degree located within the school of Nursing Program is offered on three campuses: Charlotte, Collier and Lee. The Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program is accredited until 2017 by the National League of Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC).

The ADN Program is designed to prepare the nursing student to enter the registered nursing profession. The course content provides the student with a thorough background in all aspects of nursing. Clinical practice and theoretical concepts are stressed in order to prepare the student to pass the NCLEX-RN examination. There are day basic programs and an evening / weekend basic program. The Basic Day Programs are offered on the Charlotte, Collier and Lee campuses. The Basic Evening Program is offered on the Lee campus only. Students are eligible to apply to the Basic Nursing Program which requires no previous experience in nursing.

The ADN program at Edison State College is nationally recognized as high-quality programs with rigorous standards to best prepare students for rewarding nursing careers. ESC's nursing program is unique in offering state-of-the-art technology in teaching and instructional techniques. The faculties in the nursing programs are professionally qualified with a complement of those who are nationally certified educators, practicing nurses and nurse practitioners. An increasing number of nursing faculty members are in doctorate programs or have recently earned Doctoral degrees in Nursing.

The Edison State College Associate Degree Nurse graduate is eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). Upon successful completion of the NCLEX-RN, the graduate enters the noble profession of the Registered Nurse and obtains a state license.

The Registered Nurse provides hands-on daily care. With a distinct knowledge, nurses diagnose, monitor, educate, manage and supervise. Registered Nurses coordinate health care teams, provide or facilitate care, develop policy, conduct research, and exercise expert clinical decision-making skills. They are a critical partner with physicians and a variety of other health care practitioners in the wellness arena.

The Nursing program at Edison State College is accredited by the NLNAC. The NLNAC is located at 3343 Peachtree Road NE, Suite 500, Atlanta, Georgia 30326, telephone (404)-975-5000).

3. Information Sessions (Pre-Nursing Orientation)

Information Sessions are held on all three campuses during day hours and additionally in the evening on Lee Campus. These sessions are the best place to get your questions answered and to get correct information from the School of Nursing about the nursing program of interest. A student does not have to pre-register for these sessions on the Collier and Lee Campus, just come to the designated location and sign in to get credit for the session. You must pre-register for this session at the Charlotte Campus. A Pre-Nursing Orientation is required to apply to the AS Nursing Program. Please be punctual, as it is disruptive to others if people enter while the information sessions are in progress. 4. How do I get ready for application the nursing program?

ADMISSION PROCESS

There are usually more students that apply to the nursing program than seats available. The School of Nursing Associate in Science Degree Program accepts students that have the highest nursing admission points from the pool of potential nursing students applying. This process is called selective admissions. Because enrollment is limited, not all qualified applicants can be accepted. In the event there are more qualified applicants than spaces available, a point system for nursing admission will be utilized. For example, if the program has 24 available seats for new students, the 24 students with the top nursing admission points would be offered the seats. The nursing admission points are explained in more detail below. The admission process established by the School of Nursing is designed to select those candidates with the best qualifications.

In addition to the admission requirements for the College, the following are requirements for *provisional* admission to the ADN Program (full admission will be based on a clear background check and drug test). It is the responsibility of the applicant to complete all the requirements below prior to the application deadline to be considered for the Associate in Science Degree in nursing program.

There is no waiting list for the School of Nursing programs at Edison State College.

Students are to complete the following:

8.	<p>Campus Choice. On the application the student may choose up to three campuses or programs by ranking them 1, 2, or 3. Number 1 is the first choice, 2 is the second choice and 3, third choice. If a Student does not choose 3 rankings and only checks one program, it will be assumed the applicant is saying they do not wish to consider admission to another program. Make your choices carefully. If you accept your 3rd choice, you will be attending that program on that campus for five semesters, for the Basic Program, or three semesters, for the AP program.</p>
9.	<p>Transfer policy: Under normal circumstances, transfers between campuses are prohibited. Should extenuating circumstances arise which are beyond the student's control, transfer requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis by a committee comprised of the Program Coordinators and the District Director of Nursing. All requests for transfer must include supporting documentation.</p>
10.	<p><u>Arrest Records</u>: Graduation from ESC Nursing Program does not guarantee that the Board of Nursing will allow you to take the NCLEX-RN. The Board of Nursing can deny application for licensure for certain reasons.</p>

5. Core Performance Standards*

Nursing involves the provision of direct patient care for individuals and is characterized by the application of knowledge in the skillful performance of nursing functions. Therefore, in order to be retained in the program before and after admission, all students must be able to demonstrate the following abilities:

The Florida Board of Nursing requires criminal checks on all applicants for licensure and any nursing licensure applicant who has an arrest record to present those records. The Florida Board of Nursing is the state agency authorized to issue nursing licenses.

6. Technical Performance Standards

The School of Nursing complies with the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Any students requiring special accommodations or classroom modifications should first see the Coordinator for Students with Disabilities at Edison State College (<http://www.edison.edu/adaptiveservices/>). It is then the student's responsibility to communicate documented modifications or needs to the Coordinator/Professors at the beginning of each course.

Nursing at the associate degree level involves the provision of direct care for individuals and is characterized by the application of knowledge in the skillful performance of nursing functions. Therefore, in order to successfully complete the clinical and laboratory requirements, all students must possess:

1. Sufficient visual acuity such as is needed in the accurate preparation and administration of medications, and for the observation necessary for patient assessment and nursing care.
2. Sufficient auditory perception to receive verbal communication from patients and members of the health team and to assess health needs of people through the use of monitoring devices such as cardiac monitors, stethoscopes, IV infusion pumps, fire alarms, etc.
3. Sufficient gross and fine motor coordination to respond promptly and implement the skills, including the manipulation of equipment required in meeting health needs.
4. Sufficient communication skills (speech, reading, writing) to interact with individuals and communicate their needs promptly and effectively as may be necessary in the individual's interest.

5. Sufficient intellectual and emotional functions to plan and implement care for individuals.

7. Physical, Emotional, and Mental Requirements

In order to provide direct patient care safely and to be able to utilize equipment in a variety of health care settings, the student must meet the following physical, mental and emotional requirements.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Ability to perform repetitive tasks.
- Ability to walk the equivalent of five miles per day.
- Ability to reach above shoulder level.
- Ability to hear tape recorded transcriptions.
- Ability to distinguish colors.
- Ability to adapt to shift work.
- High degree of manual dexterity.
- Ability to work with chemicals and detergents.
- Ability to tolerate exposure to dust and/or fumes.
- Ability to grip.
- High degree of physical flexibility.
- Ability to bend knees.
- Ability to sit for periods of time.
- Ability to climb stairs or ladder.
- Ability to stand for long periods of time.
- Ability to lift 25 pounds.
- Ability to squat.
- Ability to perform CPR.

MENTAL AND EMOTIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Ability to cope with a high level of stress.
- Ability to make fast decisions under high pressure.
- Ability to cope with the anger/fear/hostility of others in a calm manner.
- Ability to manage altercations.
- Ability to concentrate.
- High degree of flexibility.
- Ability to cope with confrontation.
- Ability to handle multiple priorities in a stressful situation.
- Ability to assist with problem resolution.
- Ability to work alone.
- Ability to demonstrate a high degree of patience.
- Ability to adapt to shift work.
- Ability to work in areas that are close and crowded.

8. HESI Exam

The HESI is a standardized examination, used nationwide by nursing schools to assess college level knowledge in the areas of Biology, Anatomy and Physiology, Math, Vocabulary, Reading and Grammar. A student is given a composite (overall average) score at the end of the exam. The student is aware of their score as soon as the test is completed. The score of this exam is one of the three categories used to compute admission scores for the ADN Program (See [Admission Score Sheet](#) available on the Edison State College School of Nursing website.). No other examination is accepted in place of the HESI.

The ESC bookstores sell the HESI approved study guide should students wish to purchase. There is also a company website: <http://evolve.elsevier.com>. Occasionally the ESC Continuing Education Department has a live HESI test review available. This live HESI review is not part of the Nursing Department. Please contact ESC Continuing Education for more information.

Each student is permitted to take the examination twice in a period from January 1 through December 31, but the two attempts must be a minimum of 30 days apart. The student may use the highest score from the two attempts and a copy must be attached to the student's application. Scheduling the examination is a first come, first scheduled, limited number of seats exam. The exam is held on the Lee County Campus in Room AA- 173 or AA-174. Students are given 4 hours to complete the six sections of the exam and a print out of the final grade will be provided to the student. Any exception to this 4 hour test limit would need a letter from the ESC Disability Office. The score is valid for two years and expires on the second anniversary of the test date. Should the test day fall short of the application period, the test will not be accepted and the student must provide a test result that is valid.

Currently the HESI examination cost to the student is \$60.00. This price may rise before the next printing of this handbook. The student should contact the Cashier's office to verify the current price of this exam. The following are the steps to pay and schedule the HESI examination:

- On Lee campus: Pay the campus cashier for the HESI exam. Bring the HESI receipt to building AA (The Nursing Building) Room 167 M (Sandy Krotov, Nursing Staff Assistant, M-F 0830 am – 4:30 pm) or you may fax your receipt to 239.489.9086 ATTN: Michelle. The student should also send a follow-up email to Michelle DeBona letting her know the receipt has been faxed (hesi@edison.edu). The student can include on the fax and email the student contact information and desired scheduled testing date. The student will receive a confirmation email.
- On Collier Campus: bring the HESI receipt to the nursing office, Nursing Staff Assistant. (M-F 8:30 am – 4:30 pm) The staff assistant will help you further.
- On Charlotte Campus: bring the HESI receipt to building "E" room 111 (Wendy Williams Morris, Nursing Staff Assistant, M-F (8:30 am – 4:30 pm) and Ms Morris will assist you further.

8.1 HESI No-Show Policy

Guidelines:

The purpose of this policy is to summarize the policy for when a student does not show for a paid HESI exam after making a reservation. This policy is necessary because when a student schedules an appointment for a HESI, there are limited seats available to take this exam. Once a student is confirmed no other student may schedule for that seat. When a person does not show for the exam, that seat could have been used by another student.

1. Student will follow all scheduling and registering policies for the HESI Exam.
2. Student will schedule and receive a confirmatory scheduling e-mail listing the testing date, location, time and date.
3. If the student does not show for the appointment, the student forfeits their HESI fee. This will not be considered one of the two yearly attempts for taking the HESI Exam.
4. Exceptions to this policy are illness with a Health Care Practitioner note or documented death or serious illness in the family. Family illness would require a note from the attending Health Care Practitioner.
5. A student may re-schedule the exam only until 10 days prior to the schedule date of the HESI exam. This is because the college is required to order and have these exams available a week prior to the examination by the HESI company.

9. Criminal Background Screening

Certain health care practitioners are subject to criminal background screening at initial licensure. Currently, there are three different groups of background screening: statewide, national and level II.

- Statewide criminal background screenings are performed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. The results are reviewed by the applicant's respective health care board and used to decide whether to grant a license.
 - Registered Nurse applying for licensure by examination
 - Licensed Practical Nurse applying for licensure by examination
- Statewide and National criminal background screenings require fingerprinting and are performed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the Federal Bureau of Investigations. The results are reviewed by the applicant's respective health care board and used to decide whether to grant a license. This screening does not meet the definition of a Level II screening
 - Chiropractic Physician
 - Drug Wholesaler/Certified Designated Representative
 - Medical Doctor
 - Nurses
 - Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner
 - License Practical Nurse applying for licensure by examination
 - Registered Nurse applying for licensure by examination
 - Othotist and Prosthetist
 - Osteopathic Physician
 - Pharmacy Owner
 - Podiatric Physician
 - Prescription Department Manager
- Level II statewide and national criminal background screenings are conducted pursuant to Chapter 435, F.S., and section 408.809, F.S., which require fingerprinting, and are performed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the Federal Bureau of Investigations. The results are reviewed for disqualifying offenses in sections 435.04 and 408.809, F.S., by the applicant's respective health care board and are used to determine whether to grant license and, where deemed appropriate, an exemption

- Certified Nursing Assistant (Results of this screening are provided to the Agency for Health Care (AHCA) electronically and are available for viewing on AHCA's Background Screening Results website)

Health care practitioners who are screened by ACHA for employment in a health care facility or as a provider in accordance with 408.809, F.S., may have disqualifying offenses. When AHCA identifies a disqualifying offense based on section 435.04, F.S., or section 408.809, F.S., the practitioner may request an exemption from disqualification through the respective licensing board.

Health care practitioners may request an exemption by submitting an Exemption from Disqualification form

If the practitioner is not subject to criminal background screening by the licensing board, DOH may obtain a copy of the criminal background screening from AHCA, if available.

9.1 Criminal History Findings

Any applicant or enrolled student who has been found guilty of, regardless of adjudication, or entered a plea of nolo contendere, or guilty to, any offense under the provisions of Florida Statutes or under similar statutes of another jurisdiction will be disqualified from admission or continued enrollment in the Nursing Program.

Included offenses are:

- Murder
- Manslaughter
- Vehicular homicide
- Killing of an unborn child by injury to the mother
- Assault, if the victim of the offense was a minor
- Aggravated assault
- Battery, if the victim of the offense was a minor
- Aggravated battery
- Kidnapping
- False imprisonment
- Sexual battery
- Prohibited acts of persons in familial or custody authority
- Lewd and lascivious behavior
- Arson
- Theft, robbery, and related crimes, if the offense is a felony
- Fraudulent sale of controlled substances, only if the offense was a felony
- Incest
- Abuse or neglect of a disabled adult or elderly person
- Exploitation of disabled adult or elderly person
- Aggravated child abuse
- Child abuse
- Negligent treatment of children
- Sexual performance by a child
- Alcohol or Drug offenses which were a felony, or if the offense involved a minor
- Offenses indicating unfitness to serve as a health care professional

In addition, students or applicants with arrests pending disposition with any felony convictions and loss of civil rights, or students on probation will be disqualified from admission to the nursing program.

All records from the criminal history findings will be sent directly to the Nursing Program Criminal Background Check Representative. Background information will be provided to Clinical facilities as part of an attestation requirement by the facility.

9.2 Substance Use/Abuse Policy

Area health care agencies are drug- free places of employment. All health care agencies require a negative screen prior to hiring a new employee. The ESC School of Nursing Program has been asked to ensure that all nursing students have a negative drug test. Program applicants are required to obtain a substance abuse drug screen and are subject to random drug screens for cause upon admission to the program. Results of the drug screens are important for clinical rotations and subsequent completion of the nursing program. Applicants with a positive or adulterated result on the drug screen will be given an opportunity to explain the result. If the explanation is unacceptable or cannot be satisfactorily documented by the applicant's physician, the applicant shall not be accepted into the program. If already enrolled, the student will be dismissed from the nursing program.

The applicant may reapply and be considered for application to any health program after positive reference from a treatment team who has followed the applicant for at least two years, and has dealt specifically with the applicant's problem of chemical dependence.

Lee Campus Evening Nursing Program – **five semesters**, approximately 20 months, after admission to the ADN Program. This **does** include summer sessions.

10.4 Lee Campus Evening Basic Nursing Program Information

The Evening Basic Nursing Program at Edison State College is designed to assist individuals to obtain an Associate in Science Degree in Nursing. The program has limited enrollment. The admission process is designed to select those candidates with the best qualifications. Final acceptance is contingent on results of criminal background checks and drug screening for all Nursing programs of study.

Estimated Schedule of Class/Clinical Days

*** Clinical schedule times cannot always be predicted due to hospital/community negotiation.**

Semester 1 (Fall)

- Two evenings a week classes times will be starting at 5:00 or 5:30 and will last 4 hours on one evening and four or five hours on a second evening.
 - There are no clinical weekend hours this semester.

Semester 2 (Spring)

- One evening 5:30-9:30, one evenings 5:30-8:30
- Clinical: 7 or 8 hours on day shift – mostly weekend Saturday or Sunday but schedule could include other days
 - Will need to go to hospital Friday afternoon or evening before clinics to obtain patient research information.

Semester 3 (Summer)

- Two evenings a week: 5:30 pm – 9:30 pm
- Clinical: 10 or 11 hours – mostly weekend Saturday or Sunday but schedule could include other days
 - Two special visits on a weekday, one visiting an Operating Department at a local hospital, one for a clinical visit to see nursing outside a hospital setting.

Semester 4 (Fall)

- ½ semester (8 weeks) Nursing of Mother and Child (Maternal Nursing)
 - Lecture 2 evenings a week 5:30 – 9:30
 - Clinical on Saturday or Sunday or weekday evening.
- ½ semester (8 weeks) Nursing of Children (Pediatrics)
 - Lecture 2 evenings a week 5:30 – 9:30
 - Clinical every Saturday or Sunday or weekday evening.

Semester 5 (Spring) (12 week semester)

- Classes with lecture 2 evenings a week 5:30 – 9:30
- Clinical every evening for 12 weeks – weekends or weekdays as available.
- Clinical Preceptorship with a nurse at a local facility where you will work one on one with that nurse for a total of 96 hours.

NCLEX REVIEW

Every student will be required to attend a 4 consecutive day NCLEX review workshop, provided on Lee campus, before the student is granted program completion status. Lee campus pinning ceremony is usually held on the last evening of this review.

The days and hours of clinical experiences changes each semester. In general, clinical experience for each course is 1-2 days a week and generally 7-8 or up to 12 hours each day assigned.

Requirement to Disclose

The Edison State College (ESC) School of Nursing requires you to complete the attached **Student Disclosure Form**. Pursuant to state law, an applicant for a license to practice as a registered nurse must not have been convicted of a crime that has a direct bearing on the individual's ability to practice nursing competently nor have committed an act that would constitute a ground for disciplinary sanction under state law.

While a criminal history is not an automatic barrier to consideration for admission to Edison State College School of Nursing, each applicant will be considered on a case by case basis. Serious crimes, such as crimes of violence or dishonesty, are particularly disfavored. Applicants are advised that the School relies on third parties, such as hospitals and other health facilities, to provide clinical education and that a criminal history can affect the School's ability to find a placement. ESC School of Nursing has no control over these third parties and the School makes no guarantee that it can place any student, with or without a criminal history.

Candor about the applicant's criminal history is highly important: failure to disclose may result in the withdrawal of acceptance or, in the case of an accepted or matriculated student, dismissal from Edison State College School of Nursing.

You are required to notify the ESC School of Nursing Program Coordinator on the campus to which you are seeking or granted admission on an annual basis, or more frequently, of any changes in your status.

Full Disclosure Required

Applicants are required to disclose any arrests, charges, convictions, or probation/diversion in writing (even if a charge has been dismissed). You must report **anything** that may come up on a national or Florida state background check. You must complete this form to the best of your ability. If in doubt, disclose the charge. This means that your answers must be truthful, accurate, and complete. If you know of certain information yet are unsure whether to disclose it, you must disclose the information.

1. I understand that if I am a finalist for admission that I must submit to and pay any costs required for criminal background checks. I understand that information obtained from a criminal history check may result in a failure to be approved for required placement assignments, and as such may result in my inability to progress through the ESC School of Nursing program.

I understand if an assigned clinical agency does not accept me as a nursing student based on my criminal background, it may result in an inability to progress through the ESC School of Nursing program, as such required agency placements are prerequisites to the completion of any School of Nursing degree.
