HONORS SCHOLAR PROGRAM - HONORS THESIS/RESEARCH PROJECT

A 3-hour credit course of independent research can be taken by an HSP student to add an extra dimension to the Honors Scholar Program. Registration for the course is possible after completing a total of 9 hours of Honors courses in two academic areas. The student should complete this form and submit it to the Honors Scholar Program Coordinator by the sixth week before the semester that credit will be received for the course.

Responsibilities of Student

1. Choose a faculty member to assist you who is qualified in the subject area you wish to explore.
2. Make an appointment with the faculty member the semester before you plan to take the Independent Research Honors course and receive approval of the topic. Signature of instructor, the HSP Coordinator and Dean of the Division is necessary.
3. Obtain the course number from the Division Dean, and register for the independent course.
4. Plan weekly appointment times to consult with the instructor. These appointments should be considered the same as a class: be there and be on time. Instructor must be notified if any emergency prohibits your attendance.
5. Make an appointment with a reference librarian for aid in approaches of literature search on your topic.
6. The Honors Independent Research course is a 3-hour elective; there should be consideration of its demanding research responsibilities when planning your schedule.
7. Present your project at a scheduled Thesis Presentation.

Responsibilities of Faculty Directing Honors Thesis/Research

1. Assist student with clarification of topic, including preparation of prospectus.
2. Direct student through development of research design.
3. Assist student in design of literature search.
4. Be available to student for weekly appointments and special conferences at times mutually agreed by the faculty member and the student.
5. Evaluate progress and problems encountered by a student in conduct of the study.
6. Evaluate final research product and assign a final grade based on the paper or project completed.
7. Assist the student to plan an oral presentation that would review the research completed and share the conclusions reached at a meeting with other faculty and HSP students.
