Associate in Science Degree

Basic Program

The Basic Nursing Program at Edison College is offered to assist individuals to obtain an Associate of Science Degree in Nursing. The program is comprised of general education courses as well as clinical nursing courses. The curriculum incorporates classroom instruction, clinical laboratory simulation, and clinical practice in area hospitals, long-term care facilities, and various community health centers. It is recommended that all general education courses are completed before entering the nursing program. Graduates of the program will possess the knowledge, values, and skills essential to practice nursing in a dynamic and rapidly changing health care environment. Graduates are eligible to take the licensure examination (NCLEX-RN) administered by the State Board of Nursing in Florida.

ADMISSION PROCESS

The Nursing Program has selective admissions. Because enrollment is limited, not all qualified applicants can be accepted. In the event there are more qualified applicants than spaces available, a point system for admission will be utilized. The admission process established by the Nursing Programs is designed to select those candidates with the best qualifications.

In addition to the admission requirements for the College, the following are requirements for admission to the Nursing Program:

1. Graduation from high school or receipt of a General Educational Development certificate (GED).
2. Completion of admission requirements to Edison College (EC), including application and testing.*
3. Completion of all Learning Assistance courses, if required, by the start of the program.
4. Completion of program prerequisites: MAC 1105 (College Algebra) or higher, *or* STA 2023 (Introductory Statistics), and BSC 1093C (Anatomy & Physiology I) **prior to application deadline.**
5. Attainment of a minimum grade of "C" or above in all general education courses, including prerequisites, required in the Nursing Program.
6. Cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 or higher in all required general education courses completed.
7. **Testing:** Completion of the HESI test with a score of 74 or higher is **required** for admission. Until 6/30/08 ACT test scores of 17 or higher will be accepted in lieu of HESI.
8. Submission of **Official** transcripts from post-secondary institutions (including Edison College) showing completion of any of the 8 required General Education classes. Transcripts should be sent to the Registrar's Office **and** to the Nursing Office.
9. Evaluation of all transcripts from previous colleges by the EC Records and Registration Department for transfer of credits.
10. Attendance at a Pre-Admission Nursing Orientation.**
11. Completion of the Nursing Basic Program Application along with \$15.00 application fee receipt (by deadline).
12. Application deadlines: May 15 for Summer B Program and August 31 for Fall B Program.

TRANSFER POLICY

Under normal circumstances, transfers between campuses are prohibited. Should extenuating circumstances arise which are beyond the student's control, transfer requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis by a committee comprised of either the Basic or Advanced Placement Program Coordinators and the District Director of Nursing. All requests for transfer must include supporting documentation.

*The FCLEPT is used for placement in English and Algebra. It is highly recommended that students review English & Algebra before taking this test.

**Students must attend a pre-admission nursing orientation prior to applying to the Nursing Program. The information exchanged is vital to applicant's understanding of the admission process. NURSING PROGRAM-CORE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS*

Nursing involves the provision of direct patient care for individuals and is characterized by the application of knowledge in the skillful performance of nursing functions. Therefore, in order to be retained in the program after admission, all students must be able to demonstrate the following abilities:

ISSUE	STANDARD	EXAMPLES(not inclusive)
Critical Thinking	Critical thinking sufficient for clinical judgment.	Competent assessment of patient in timely manner, correct interpretation of assessment, readily respond with appropriate interventions, treatment plans, ability to work alone and to make correct independent decisions.
Interpersonal	Interpersonal abilities sufficient to interact with individuals, families, and groups from a variety of social, emotional, cultural, and intellectual backgrounds.	Life and death situations, work with families stressed by the condition of a loved-one, working with other health-care providers in stressful situations.
Communication	Communication abilities sufficient for interaction with others in verbal and written form.	Can follow verbal and/or written instructions. Must communicate patient responses, document and interpret therapeutic procedures performed on patient, initiate health teaching, consult with other health care providers in professional manner.
Mobility	Physical abilities sufficient to move from room to room, and walk in hallways, maneuver in small spaces. Including the strength necessary to lift patients as needed.	Walking to and from departments to patient rooms, room to room to take care of all patients on a team, assisting in patient transport, administer CPR.
Motor Skills	Gross and fine motor abilities sufficient to provide safe and effective nursing care.	Perform vital signs, calibrate and use equipment, position patients. transport patients, physical assessment.
Hearing	Auditory ability sufficient to monitor and assess health needs.	Auscultation of BP, breath sounds, heart sounds, bowel sounds, hearing alarms, emergency signals, call bells, phones, cries for help, converse with patients, family, and staff
Visual	Visual ability sufficient for observation and assessment necessary in nursing care.	Reading patient charts/flow sheet/monitors, prepare and administer medications, assessing patient skin color, reading thermometers.
Tactile	Tactile ability sufficient for physical assessment and to provide nursing intervention.	Perform palpation, giving injections, starting IV's, functions physical examination and/or those related to therapeutic intervention, i.e. urinary catheterization.
Strength/Stamina	Sufficient stamina to provide care and related responsibilities for extended periods of time (8-12 hours)	Adapt to shift work, lift without restrictions from standing position, ability to bend, position, and lift patients.

The Florida Board of Nursing requires criminal checks on all applicants for licensure and any nursing licensure applicant who has an arrest record to present those records. The Florida Board of Nursing is the state agency authorized to issue nursing licenses.
