Basic Digital Camera Operators Course

This course is designed for the novice digital camera user. It is assumed that the attendant will have little, if any, photographic experience. The attendance will be introduced to fundamental photographic concepts, in addition to concepts which are specific to digital cameras such as “what do ‘megapixels’ mean” and “what are the benefits of a CCD versus a CMOS equipped camera?” The attendant will leave the course with the knowledge of being able to make a confident, informed decision on camera and accessory purchases from an objective source. Basic photographic and subject matter composition will also be covered. Student must bring their own camera.
