



Digital Moviemaking for Beginners

Beginning students will work one-on-one with a professional movie producer to understand the technical and aesthetic basics of the digital moviemaking process from concept to completion. Students will collaborate as a film crew in the production of one or more final short films.

COURSE OUTLINE

CLASS 2 -- PREPRODUCTION: CASTING, SCHEDULING, AND ASSIGNING FILM CREW ROLES

CLASS 3 -- PRODUCTION I: DIGITAL VIDEO CAMERA AND SOUND BASICS

CLASS 4 -- PRODUCTION II: DIRECTING, ACTING AND INTERVIEWING FOR THE CAMERA

CLASS 5 -- POST PRODUCTION I: EDITING AND ASSEMBLING THE "ROUGH CUT" MOVIE

CLASS 6 -- POSTPRODUCTION II: CREATING THE FINE CUT MOVIE AND SCREENING YOUR WORK
