



Screenwriting- Advanced

Students who have completed both the “Screenwriting for Beginners” course and the first thirty pages of a narrative feature film will finish their screenplays in this advanced course. Students will continue to read Hollywood-produced screenplays and analyze classic Hollywood movies in order to understand screen storytelling conventions and master the basics of professional screenplay structure, especially as it relates to acts two and three of their scripts. Students will work from a fully realized treatment of their screenplays, and will also spend time discussing the business of screenplay writing.

All materials will be provided by the instructor, but students must have home computers and home internet access in order to download free online screenwriting software (students who already own/use screenwriting for-pay software programs can use their own). Students highly encouraged to bring laptops to class, if available.
