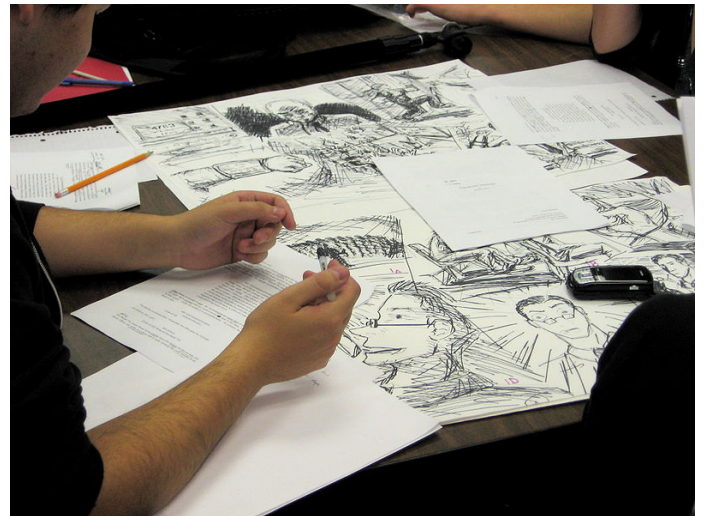




Screenwriting for Beginners

Beginning students will review Hollywood-produced screenplays and watch and analyze classic Hollywood movies in order to understand screen storytelling conventions and master the basics of professional screenplay writing. Students will learn how to “pitch” and will also read professional screenplay coverage and studio script notes. Topics covered include proper screenplay format, cinematic structure, movie concept, characterization, dialogue, story, plot and theme, and a section on “selling your script.” Students will complete the first 30 pages (act one) of a screenplay by the final class.

All materials will be provided by the instructor, but students must have home computers and home internet access in order to download free online screenwriting software (students who already own/use screenwriting for-pay software programs can use their own). Students highly encouraged to bring laptops to class, if available.
