Learn more beautiful watercolor painting!

You will learn six specific techniques and objectives taught through painting a different subject each week. If you've painted a bit and are now ready to expand your horizons and try a few new things, this is for you. Enjoy learning through creation of such compositions as a moonlit night (pictured), a rural landscape at sunrise, a snowstorm in the woods, and a close-focus floral. Intended for those who may have taken "Beginning



Watercolor" or comparable instruction and have a modest acquaintance with the materials and basic techniques. Your instructor will give individual assistance as needed and demonstrates by painting at each session.

This is Phil's new "intermediate watercolor", as it's not a repeat of what I did the first time, but moves on into more about technique and specific design or composition challenges, such as a whole class on how to paint clouds, another on water, reflections and waves, etc.

Materials: (These are in addition to the materials for Beginners)

1 page of very rough sandpaper
One small cellulose sponge
Masking fluid and brown packing tape
Water spray bottle
Safety Razor blades
Several sheets of 140 lb Arches cold press paper 11" X 14"

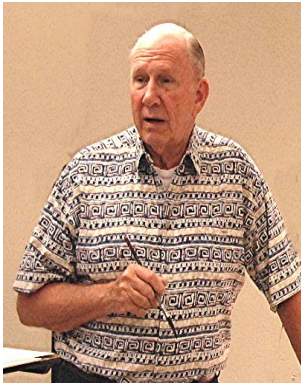
