Modern Greek for Beginners



As you know, the English language is riddled with Greek words. The word “Alphabet” for instance is formed by the first two letters “alpha” and “beta”, and there are countless other words like “gymnasium” and “theatre”. At the same time though, Modern Greek can be challenging.

With this course, students will learn to speak Modern Greek more quickly than they may expect. The goal is to make them comfortable using their new language in the practical situations that they encounter in everyday life, for example: travel, conducting business, meeting people, using the telephone, meetings, participating in a conversation effectively, etc. With this communicative and dynamic approach, they will rapidly find themselves speaking in a new language
