Precious Metal Clay

Metal Clay is a term applied to several forms and types of metal powders mixed with organic binders and water to form a malleable material that can be shaped, molded or worked as a typical clay, dried then fired either in a kiln or with a torch which causes the binder to burn away leaving a finished piece that is pure metal.
