JEWELRY/METALSMITHING – ADVANCED



This class is intended for students who wish to expand on their knowledge of design development and add to their repertoire of metalsmithing techniques. Instructor will assist student in exploring different concepts based upon individual skill level. New techniques may include chasing and repoussé, etching, fold-forming, forging, riveting and other cold connections, shell-forming, and stone setting.
