1. **Back to the Movement, 1989.** This *Eyes on the Prize* Civil Rights Movement documentary episode examines a major riot in an African American community in Miami, and the election of Chicago's first black mayor.
2. **Ocoee: Legacy of the Election Day Massacre, 2002.** Directed by Sandra Krasa and Bianca White. This documentary examines what happened to the African American community of Ocoee, Florida, when two black men attempted to vote in 1920.
3. **Rosewood, 1997.** Directed by John Singleton. In 1923 a white mob destroyed the African American community of Rosewood, Florida.

4. **Ruby in Paradise, 1997.** Directed by Victor Nunez. A young woman arrives in a Florida resort town during the off season to make a fresh start.
5. **Shadows and Reflections: Florida's Lost Peoples, 1998.** By the Florida Anthropological Society and Florida Department of State Division of Historical Resources. Visit a prehistoric slaughter site on the Aucilla River and the mounds at Lake Jackson near Tallahassee in this documentary about Native Americans in Florida.
6. **Their Eyes Were Watching God, 2005.** Directed by Darnell Martin. Based on the novel by Zora Neale Hurston. Janie Crawford is a free-spirited black woman who defies gender, class, and racial stereotypes in 1920s Florida.
7. **Ulee's Gold, 1997.** Directed by Victor Nunez. A Florida bee-keeper must raise his grand-daughters when their father goes to prison and their mother is missing.
8. **Unprecedented: the 2000 Presidential Election, 2002.** Directed by Richard Ray Perez and Joan Sekler. This documentary examines the battle for the 2000 national election in Florida, where electoral irregularities marred the election.
9. **Vernon, Florida, 1982.** Directed by Errol Morris. Fire up the pickup and head down to the bizarre backwater town of Vernon, Florida.
